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TOUR PROGRAM

On Thursday depart for Moscow, Russia

DAY 1/Fri - ARRIVE MOSCOW. Upon your arrival you'll be met and transferred to your hotel. The rest of the day is free. Welcome dinner this evening. (D)

DAY 2/Sat - MOSCOW. Moscow, one of the largest cities in the world, is the symbolic soul of the country. Your sightseeing tour begins at Red Square, dominated by colorful St Basil's Cathedral and the massive red walls of the Kremlin. After a visit to the Armory Museum, see Moscow University, then drive along the wide boulevards and stroll through GUM, Russia's largest department store. You'll pass the baroque Novodevichy convent and end the tour at the Arbat shopping district. The rest of the day is free. (B)

DAY 3/Sun - MOSCOW. Today we travel 75 km North to a small town of Sergiev Posad - founded in the 14th century and renowned as a center of ancient Russian art and architecture. For centuries it served as a religious capital of Russia. Within the old walled city admire the fairy-tale golden and blue domes of the Holy Trinity St. Sergius Lavra, one of the most beautiful of all monasteries. After lunch, return to Moscow, the rest of the day is free. This evening take an optional tour Moscow by Night & Subway, to see the metro stations which Stalin called "Palaces for the People". (B, L)

DAY 4/Mon - MOSCOW-ST. PETERSBURG. Time at leisure in Moscow, before transfer to railway station for a four hours high speed Sapsan train ride to St. Petersburg. Upon arrival at the St. Petersburg, transfer to your hotel. (B, D)

DAY 5/Tue - ST. PETERSBURG. There are not many cities in the world that can match the grace of St. Petersburg. When Peter the Great founded the city in 1703, he hired Europe's best architects. Spread over 100 islands linked by over 600 bridges it is often referred to as the "Venice of the North". Today, we'll visit Palace Square with Winter Palace, Senate Square with the monument to Russian Emperor Peter the Great, St. Isaac's Square and Cathedral, Smolny Cathedral, Cruiser Aurora, Field of Mars, and Nevsky prospect. Visit the Peter and Paul Fortress, built in 1703 on a small island with the Peter and Paul Cathedral, which towers in the center of the fortress and served as the burial place for Russian Emperors. In the evening, you can join an optional Russian Folklore evening or Evening Canal Cruise. (B)

DAY 6/Wed - ST. PETERSBURG. This morning you'll visit to the world-famous Hermitage, housing more than four million works of art. It ranks among one of the largest and oldest museums of the world, founded in 1764 by Catherine the Great. Spend the rest of the day at leisure exploring the city or you may choose to take an optional tour to visit Catherine Palace & Park in Pushkin or to Petrodvorets, Peterhof Summer Palace of Peter the Great. (B, D)

DAY 7/Thu - ST. PETERSBURG-TALLINN. We depart via Narva, where we stop for lunch, for Tallinn, the capital of the

Republic of Estonia, situated on the southern coast of the Finnish bay. This old town has the typical narrow medieval streets, towers, town walls, Gothic churches, trading and residential houses of the 13th-17th centuries. (B, D)

DAY 8/Fri - TALLINN-RIGA. Our walking tour of the Old Town (Vanalin), a UNESCO World Heritage site starts in the Upper Town visiting the Toompea Castle, the present seat of the Parliament, orthodox Alexander Nevsky Cathedral and Dome Church (Toomkirik) from the 13th century. In the Lower Town see the 14th century gothic Town Hall (Raekoda Gooti-style), Niguliste church on the main shopping streets of Old Town. In the afternoon, depart to Riga, the capital of the Republic of Latvia. (193 miles) (B, D)

DAY 9/Sat - RIGA. Riga is another major Baltic port dating back to the age of the Hanseatic League, situated at the mouth of the Dougava River. The city's narrow medieval streets display a wide variety of architectural style: Romanesque, Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque and Classical. During your sightseeing tour, see the Riga Castle, the magnificent Cathedral, St. Jacobs Cathedral, St. Peter's Church, the Parliament building, the Liberty Monument, the Academy of Art, the State Art Gallery and the district of Art Nouveau houses. The afternoon is at leisure. (B)

DAY 10/Sun - RIGA-VILNIUS. Morning departure for Vilnius, the capital of Lithuania (205 miles) After settling in at your hotel the rest of the day at leisure. (B, D)

DAY 11/Mon - VILNIUS. The city of Vilnius has been inhabited since the 9th century. In the Old Vilnius visit Peter and Paul Church and St. Anna's Church. View Vilnius University, dating back to 1570, Gedimeno's Tower in the Upper Town and Vilnius Castle. The afternoon is free or you may take an optional excursion to Trakai. (B)

DAY 12/Tue - VILNIUS-WARSAW. We bid farewell to the former Soviet Union and cross the border to Poland. At day's end we reach Warsaw for overnight. (B, L, D)

DAY 13/Wed - WARSAW. This 700 year old capital of Poland is a symbol of Nationhood and the will to survive against great odds. A sightseeing tour includes a drive along the famous Royal Route from magnificent Castle Square to Lazienki Park with its Palace, summer residence of the last King of Poland. Pass by the Palace of Science and Culture (known as a "wedding cake"), the Saxon Gardens, the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Monument to the Heroes of the Warsaw Ghetto and the Barbican. Continue with the walking tour of the Old Town, Old Market Square, and St. John's Cathedral. The rest of the day is free or an optional late afternoon Chopin concert. (B)

DAY 14/Thu - DEPART WARSAW. After breakfast you will be transferred to the airport for your homebound flight. (B)

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Travel Tips . . .



TIME: Eight hours in Moscow and seven hours in the Baltics ahead of US Eastern Daylight Time. The 24-hour clock is used.

ELECTRICITY: 220V/50 cycles. All purpose converter and 2-prong adapter are required for US appliances.

WARDROBE: Dress comfortably. Casual clothes of wrinkle-free fabrics are suggested for daily wear. Valuable jewelry should be left at home. Take a warm sweater or jacket, an umbrella or a raincoat with a hood. Comfortable walking shoes are a must. Laundry service is available in hotels.

INNOCULATIONS: No vaccinations are required by law.

CREDIT CARDS: Most hotels, major restaurants and shops (except street vendors), accept major credits cards including Master card, Visa and rarely American Express. No Discover card.

To exchange money you can use Exchange places or ATM machines available in major cities in tourist areas.

TOUR CONDITIONS

RESERVATIONS/PAYMENTS: A non refundable \$1000 deposit is required at the time of booking. Payment of the balance is due 60 days prior to departure.

TOUR COST: Tour price is based on currency exchange rates. Prices are in US Dollars. All prices include airfare, hotel, meals, and transportation.

Children discount: Children under 12 years of age travel at 50% of the adult rate. Children 12-17 years of age travel at 75% of the adult rate.

TOUR/AIRARRANGEMENTS: Every effort will be made to accommodate special requests. Airfare is based on current rates and is subject to change.

NOT INCLUDED IN THE TOUR COST: Cost of travel insurance, visas, airport taxes, and gratuities. Travel insurance is highly recommended. Single supplement rates apply to single travelers. Airline baggage fees are extra.

BAGGAGE: Free baggage allowance on transatlantic flights is 23kg (50 lbs). Excess baggage is charged at \$15 per kg. On European flights, the allowance is 10kg (22 lbs). All baggage must be checked in at least 2 hours before departure.

DOCUMENTS: A valid U.S. or foreign passport is required. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months beyond the end of the tour. A return ticket to the U.S. is required.

CANCELLATIONS: Cancellations made 90 days or more before departure will receive a 50% refund. Cancellations made 60-89 days before departure will receive a 25% refund. Cancellations made 30-59 days before departure will receive a 10% refund. Cancellations made less than 30 days before departure will receive no refund.

INSURANCE: Travel insurance is highly recommended. It covers medical expenses, trip cancellation, and lost baggage. We can assist in purchasing insurance.

RESPONSIBILITY: Participants are responsible for their own actions and belongings. The tour operator is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Other Conditions: The tour operator reserves the right to modify the itinerary or cancel the tour if necessary. Participants must adhere to local laws and customs. Smoking is prohibited during the tour. Alcohol consumption is limited. The tour operator is not responsible for any injuries or damages incurred by participants.
